Theme: Veterinary Homoeopathy: Integrating Clinical Expertise and Scientific Evidence

To strengthen evidence-based veterinary practice through systematic discussion and analysis of veterinary clinical case experiences in homoeopathy, the deliberations shall focus specifically on the evolving role of veterinary homoeopathy as a significant contributor to both research and clinical practice. The session shall also discuss safe and holistic therapeutic options for animals, including companion animals, livestock, and wildlife.

The panel will bring together experts from veterinary science and homoeopathy to share their clinical experiences and research insights in managing acute and chronic conditions in animals. Discussions will focus on methodological prescribing, integration with conventional veterinary practices, and outcomes observed in field-based and institutional settings. Special focus will be given to showcasing positive clinical outcomes and management of difficult cases in livestock with homoeopathic treatment.
